### ACRE Test

The Assessment of Children Religious Education. This assessment is designed to assist in the evaluation of religious education programs in Catholic schools and parishes. Only taken by Grades 5 and 8 in May.

### After Care/Before Care

Before/After Care exists to provide the students of St. Albert the Great School with a "home base" where they can go before and/or after school when the work schedule of their parents does not coincide with school hours.

- Before Care is available from 7:00am - 8:30am Monday through Friday
- After Care is available from 3:30pm - 6:00pm Monday through Friday

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There is an initial \$20/student enrollment fee with tuition being billed \$4/hour every half an hour. Parents are billed through the Blackbaud Tuition account on a monthly basis.

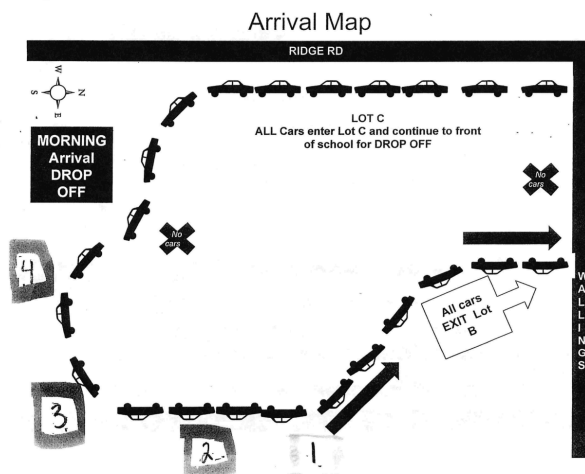

## Accelerated Reader (AR)

Grade 1 reading incentive/goal-setting program. AR helps teachers track students' independent practice and progress.

## Arrival Procedure

All cars should enter Lot C and continue to the front of the school for drop off. Drop off begins at 8:30am.



Buses will arrive between 8:30 - 8:45 am. Students are instructed to head directly to the homeroom after drop off.

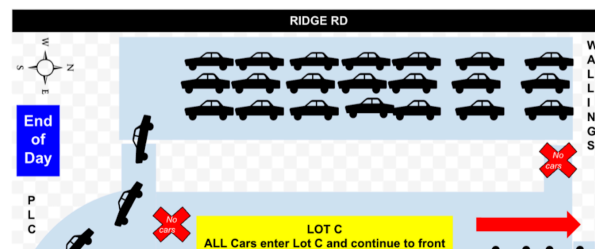

## CogAT

The Cognitive Abilities Test (CogAT) is a multiple choice K-12 assessment that measures reasoning skills with different types of verbal, quantitative and nonverbal questions. Grades 2, 4, and 6 take this exam typically toward the end of February.

## Dismissal Procedure

Students are dismissed at 3:30 pm. Cars are to enter Lot C and form straight lines. Each line will be released to swing around the front of the school to pick up their child(ren). While staff is around to help when needed, students should be prepared to independently get in and out of the car quickly and open and shut the door by themselves.



Bus riders will be dismissed in two waves. The first will be the “Out of District” buses, and second would be the North Royalton buses.

## Dress Down Days vs. Spirit Days

Dress down days are usually full out-of-uniform days that were earned as a prize due to fundraisers, birthdays, or reaching a certain goal while Spirit Days are themed dress down days that require a \$1 donation to a special

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cause. If a student happens to have gym on a dress down day, they can still dress down, but would need to wear athletic shoes.

## Enrichment Programs

A teacher, provided for each grade level, will work with students grades 3 - 8 who are working significantly above grade level. The criteria for EILA and advanced Math courses includes scores on the CogAT, MAP, and IXL assessments. Rocket

## FastLane

FastLane is our car management tool as a part of School Dismissal Manager. FastLane uses the daily dismissal information to facilitate and expedite the car line process. Parents will receive a button to press in their School Dismissal Manager app, this button sends a notification to the teacher's ActivPanel with that student's name. This alerts the student that their ride is here and they are to go outside to the front of the building for pickup.

## Field Trips

Field trips are planned throughout the year by grade level. Most grades will have two field trips in a school year - one before Christmas break and one after. These field trips occasionally allow parent chaperones to attend. Details will be provided as those field trips are planned.

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## Friends in Communion/Merciful Friends Breakfast

This is a breakfast that acknowledges students that have been nominated by their teachers/peers pertaining to specific virtue that month. Our Merciful Friends Breakfast takes place in October, November, February, March and May.

## Grading Scale

Grades K - 3 utilizes Standards Based Grading while 4 - 8 utilizes Traditional Grading. Standards Based Grading uses a number scale showing the progression and level of mastery of each skill learned. Traditional Grading



uses a letter grading system per the compilation of work and assessments in class.

Students in Grades 5-8 will receive letter grades in all classes including special classes (physical education, computer science, music, art, and Spanish). Elective courses are graded on a Pass/Fail basis for students in grades 7 and 8.

The following achievement code will be used for K-3 the entire year.

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**3 Mastered:** Student meets or exceeds the demonstration or knowledge of target content for grade-level learning with consistent success, accuracy, and independence.

**2.5:** No major errors or omissions regarding 2.0 content and partial knowledge of 3.0 content.

**2 Developing:** Student illustrates base knowledge of prerequisite content, knowledge, or skills necessary for mastery of target content.

**1.5:** Partial knowledge of the 2.0 content, but major errors or omissions regarding the 3.0 content.

**1 Beginning:** Assistance needed to demonstrate partial understanding of a score of 2.0 or 3.0.

**Blank:** Was not assessed in the grading period.

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## Gym Uniforms

Gym shirts must be worn on gym days along with gym shorts, or solid colored sweat pants. No logos or yoga pants allowed.

## High School Prep Test

An after school preparation course to prepare for one of the two most commonly administered Catholic high school entrance exams. This course is hosted at SATG, but can also be taken at other locations.

## Inbox

Inbox is a green initiative where handouts and flyers are posted on the SATG website. (<https://school.saint-albert.org/general>) Flyers can be sent to [akrejny@saint-albert.org](mailto:akrejny@saint-albert.org) for approval and posting.

## IXL

The IXL platform is a personalized digital learning space that covers the K-12 curriculum. All students will have access to both ILA and math lessons.

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## Learning Center

The Learning Center provides additional services to those students who qualify. This includes intervention specialists, instructional support staff, a psychologist, a counselor, and a speech therapist.

## Learning Commons

All students have regular access to the learning commons (library) and are free to draw from our extensive collection of books. A five-cent per day fine is charged for each overdue book. Charges for a lost or damaged book will equal the purchase price of the book. Book borrowing privileges are forfeited until a lost or damaged book has been returned or paid. Report cards will not be issued until all fines are paid. Kindergarten students are excused from paying fines, however, students must return books the first day they return. Students are not fined if they are absent on the day or days their book is due. The learning commons' collection is constantly updated and expanded. Each year we allot finances to improve our library collection. The book limit is two books weekly for each student.

## Loop

Loop Messaging is our mass communication tool and contact directory for staff, faculty, and families to send school related texts, emails and voice messages - this includes information about school closings and delays. Loop can be accessed via an online website or the Loop app.

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## Manna Gift Card Program

The Manna Gift Card Program is in place to help with your child's technology fee. You can either pay the \$250 technology fee per child, or buy \$5,000 in manna gift cards over the course of the school year. Within the first few days of school, an envelope will be sent home with your child with a manna order form. When you want to place an order, you fill out the order form and send it back to the school in the envelope provided along with payment. You can also use the RaiseRight App to purchase digital gift cards.

## MAP

MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) is an assessment for measuring achievement and growth in K-12 math and reading. MAP Testing takes place 3 times a year - results are sent to you after just a couple of weeks. This testing will determine if a student qualifies for extra support or enrichment. Parents will be notified if their child will begin to work in a small group.

## Mass

Weekly Mass occurs on Friday at 9:05 am. Buddy masses are the third Friday of every month. Kindergarteners have 7th Grade buddies, 1st Grade has 6th Grade buddies, and 2nd Grade has 8th Grade Buddies.

## Meet the Teacher Night

This session is normally held on the Monday before school begins. Parents are invited to meet their children's teachers and hear about the upcoming year's events and classroom policies. There will also be comments from our

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Pastor, our Principal, and our Assistant Principal. Should you have more than one child at the school there will be multiple presentations given throughout the evening in each classroom. Children are NOT to attend this event.

## MustangAM

Daily morning program created by the students shared with staff each morning. Homeroom teachers bring it up on their ActivPanels as the morning announcements for their students.

## Packet Pick Up/Move-In Day

Packet Pick Up takes place just prior to the start of school. Families come on site to pick up their child's schedule and other beginning of the school year information. Move-In Day allows students to bring their school supplies prior to the school year beginning to help make their backpack lighter on that first day.

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## Parent Pulse

Software that automatically surveys a portion of our parents each week, so we have a web-based dashboard with fresh, actionable feedback and data year-round.

## Parent Teacher Conferences

Conferences are held prior to Thanksgiving. They are one on one with your child's teacher to see how your child is progressing. This is a great time to bring up any issues or concerns you have with your child. Additional conferences may be scheduled on an as needed basis with our child's teacher.

## Pay Schools Central

Pay Schools Central is our online lunch payment system. All families are expected to be registered in Pay Schools Central. You can either send cash/check into school and it will be applied to your Pay Schools Central balance without the online fee. You can also add money online with ACH or credit card.

## Picture Day

Picture Day is a DRESS UP day. Girls usually wear dresses, skirts, blouses, and dress pants while boys typically wear dress shirts, polo shirts, and slacks. No jeans or shorts are allowed!



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## ProgressBook

ProgressBook is an online portal utilized for viewing your child's grades, assignments, and homework.

## Registration Gateway

Registration Gateway is our online registration program. Year to year information will be retained for emergency contact information, medical forms, and important documents. Each year you will have an opportunity to update this information. Should you need to update throughout the year please contact the office.

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## Report Cards

Report cards are issued 4 times per year. The report cards are to be reviewed digitally by a parent or guardian who will then sign an online form confirming the report was reviewed. For Q4, a hard copy of the report card along with MAP and CogAT scores are mailed to the students' home after the closing of the school year.

## Retreat Day

This is an all-school event held on Holy Wednesday. The Jr. High religion teacher plans the event while the 8th graders lead the school in different activities throughout the day.

## Rocket Shop

A virtual platform from which learners shop for small items based on their participation in both the Accelerated Reader and Reflex programs.

## Room Parents

Two parents are selected per classroom. Their job is to plan and organize class collections for teacher Christmas, End of Year, and Birthday gifts. They also plan the Halloween and Christmas Parties along with Field Day.

## School Dismissal Manager

School Dismissal Manager (SDM) is the easy to use dismissal program utilized by our school. Absences, early dismissals, late arrivals, after school

activities, and dismissal exceptions are all input by parents via their phone or computer. The school is notified electronically of any changes made - no phone calls or paper notes needed.

- Report an Absence
  - To report an absence, log into SDM, and “Report Absence”. In the note section, please list the reason and where to send any homework or missed assignments. All work may be picked up after 3:30pm in the school office or sent home with another student.
- Report Early Pick Up/Late Drop Off
  - To report an early pick up from school, select “Add Exception”, then Leaving Early, whether the student will be returning or not, and then list in the notes what time they will be picked up, the reason, and who will be picking them up.
  - To report a late arrival, select “Add Late Arrival”, and then list the reason for Late Arrival and when you estimate you may be to school.
- Report Dismissal Exception
  - If your child’s dismissal will be anything different than the ordinary, select “Add Exception” and choose how your child will be going home that day.

## School Resource Officer (SRO)

SATG has our own SRO who is a law enforcement officer who works on our campus to help ensure the safety and well-being of students, staff, and visitors. His role includes:

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1. **Safety and Security:** Monitoring the campus for any safety concerns, responding to emergencies, and helping to create a secure environment.
  2. **Education and Guidance:** Providing age-appropriate lessons on topics like safety, bullying prevention, and good citizenship, often incorporating values that align with the school's Catholic mission.
  3. **Relationship Building:** Building positive relationships with students to serve as a role model and trusted adult they can turn to for help.
  4. **Law Enforcement Liaison:** Acting as a bridge between the school and local law enforcement, assisting with any legal matters or incidents that may arise.

## School Start/End Time

School begins at 8:50 am each day. Children are permitted to enter their classrooms at 8:30 am. The school day ends at 3:30 pm.

## Science of Reading

The “Science of Reading” means an interdisciplinary body of scientific evidence that:

- Informs how students learn to read and write proficiently from early childhood through adolescence.
- Explains why some students have difficulty with reading and writing.

- Indicates that all students benefit from explicit and systematic instruction in phonemic awareness, phonics, vocabulary, fluency, comprehension, and writing to become effective readers.
- Does not rely on any model of teaching students to read based on meaning, structure and syntax, and visual cues, including a three-cueing approach.

## Service Day

An annual event in October in which parishioners participate in acts of service within our community. ALL SATG students in grades K-8 are expected to participate in a service project during that weekend.

## Spiritual Assembly

Each grade will go to the PLC for a Priest Spiritual Assembly. Each priest will meet with a grade level three times and discuss a theme for that month.

## State of the School

Each September, our Pastor and our Principal will give the State of our School, sharing an update on the past year and upcoming school year. This presentation must be attended by at least one parent from each family.

## Student Banking

Ohio Catholic Credit Union offers SATG the Bank in School Program. This gives students the chance to learn about having a savings account and watching their saved money grow. An Ohio Catholic FCU representative will



be at our school once a month to collect deposits and assist with their account.

### Supply Cart

The Supply Cart is a Student Council run school supply store that is run from a cart in the grade level hallways. Items sold include pens, pencils, erasers and other desk supplies. These items are supplementary in nature and not where all of their school supplies should be purchased.
